This book therefore differs from those of clinical medicine and surgery in that the cases selected are core obstetrics cases, a real case scenario for which management were based on clinical grounds and evidence-based medicine. In view of the possibility of progress and advances in medical sciences, readers are encouraged to complement the information contained here with other reliable sources. I hope this book will stimulate and challenge as well as build confidence for those working or learning in obstetrics.
